David Deutsch vs Solipsism



- Concern about any of this is concern about not being certain or sure. Can't prove it - but so? Can't prove anything outside maths. *Proof* not that important.
- We can't be certain about anything...and this is not a problem. (Descartes was wrong). Humans are always fallible.
- Certainty doesn't even matter. (It's just a feeling some people want),
- Knowledge matters (it changes the world).
- We know that the best theory is: we come to better
